10 Clinical Triggers For Referral To Palliative Care

*If any 1 of the following 10 conditions applies to your patient, consider referral to Palliative Care.

- 1. Would the primary care physician be surprised if the patient died within the next eighteen months? If no, consider referral.
- 2. Chronic or persistent pain or symptoms (e.g., dyspnea) requiring long-term management.
- 3. Cancer with metastasis or without any available curative or life-prolonging therapies.
- 4. Dementia causing inability to perform two or more ADLs.
- 5. Two or more hospitalizations and/or emergency visits for the same serious condition within six months.
- 6. Multiple serious illnesses or any single serious illness which remains symptomatic despite maximal treatment.
- 7. Despite medical treatment, continued oxygen dependency, shortness of breath or adverse cardiac symptoms brought on by exertion.
- 8. Unintentional and consistent weight loss over six to twelve months.
- 9. Serious illness necessitating significant and ongoing supervision or caregiving by others.
- 10. Patient, family or physician uncertainty regarding the appropriateness, usefulness or desirability of available treatment options.
