

3. PRESENTERS



Dr. Daniel Fischberg is the Medical Director for the Pain and Palliative Care Department at The Queen's Medical Center in Honolulu. He also serves as Professor and Chief of the Division of Palliative Medicine in the Department of Geriatric Medicine at JABSOM.

Dr. Fischberg holds board certification in Internal Medicine, Pain Medicine, Addiction Medicine and Hospice and Palliative Medicine and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine where he currently serves as the Chair of the Academy's Education and Learning Strategic Coordinating Committee. Dr. Fischberg is recognized as a national expert in the areas of enhancing pain and palliative care education for health care professionals, improving access to palliative care for patients at all stages of illness, and advancing evidence-based practice in palliative medicine. He currently serves on the Board of Directors for Kōkua Mau.



Dr. Rae Seitz is a Harvard trained palliative medicine specialist who was instrumental in the design, build, and establishment of home-based palliative care first at Kaiser Permanente Hawai'i then at HMSA as the lead for Supportive Care. Dr. Seitz helped to establish a hospital-based palliative care consultative service at Kaiser Foundation Hospital, is an educator and speaker about palliative medicine and palliative care. In 2013 Dr. Seitz was

recognized as one of 30 visionaries in palliative care by the Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine. She is committed to building capacity for high quality palliative care in Hawai'i. She currently sits on the board of directors of Kōkua Mau and is the current Chair of Hui Pohala whose mission is to serve as a catalyst and convener to improved access to high quality palliative care.



Dan Tuttle began consulting with the Stupski Foundation on its strategy in 2016 and joined as staff in 2018. As Director of Health, he runs the Foundation's grant making aimed at transforming serious illness care and maximizing early brain development in the Bay Area and Hawai'i. The overarching goal in serious illness care is to reduce unnecessary suffering and improve concordance of care with a person's wishes as they near the

end of their life. This work requires partnership with organizations of all types, from payers and health systems to faith- and community-based organizations.

Previously, Dan was a senior project manager at Dalberg Global Advisors, a management consultancy focused on the social sector where his clients included the African Development

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Bank; IFC/World Bank; UN; Rockefeller, Gates, and Thrive Foundations; Rainforest Alliance; and global technology and payment companies. He holds an MBA and MSc in Environment & Resources from Stanford University and a BA from the University of Arizona, where he was a Truman Scholar and Flinn Scholar. He once spoke Spanish, Swahili, Chinese, and Melanesian Pijin and published a novel in sonnets.



Judy Mohr Peterson serves as the Med-QUEST Division Administrator for the State of Hawai'i's Department of Human Services (DHS). She is a nationally recognized leader in health care delivery system reform and Medicaid. She served as president of the board of the National Association of Medicaid Directors from 2017-2019. She began her career with Oregon's Medicaid program in 1997 and served as Oregon's Medicaid Director from 2009 to 2015. In that role she was one of the architects of Oregon's successful health system transformation and coverage expansion. Before working for the Oregon Medicaid program, Dr. Mohr Peterson received her doctoral degree in Sociocultural Anthropology from the University of Texas at Austin.



Torrie Fields is the founder and CEO of Votive Health, a serious illness management services company, and is serving as Entrepreneur in Residence at Blossom Rock Ventures. She previously led the development and implementation of programs and processes at Blue Shield of California, working to improve the quality of life for people with serious illness, and their families. Ms. Fields worked as the director of palliative care at Cambia Health Solutions and as a consultant for health plans, purchasers, and academic centers evaluating the impact of palliative care on achieving the Triple Aim. Ms. Fields has led the development of highly-successful palliative care initiatives, including benefit design, case management, caregiver support, medical home development, and policy and engagement efforts. In addition, she worked as an actuary and health services researcher for health plans, health delivery systems, and local as well as federal health departments. Ms. Fields holds a master's degree in public health from the Oregon Master of Public Health Program at Oregon Health and Science University and Portland State University, a certificate in gerontology from Portland Community College, a BS in sociology from Portland State University, and a BA in communication theory from University of California, San Diego.



In her role as Associate Director for Policy at the Center to Advance Palliative Care (CAPC), **Stacie Sinclair** is dedicated to educating federal and state policymakers and key stakeholders on the value of palliative care; raising and standardizing the quality of palliative care delivery; and augmenting palliative care's voice through coalitions and strategic partnerships. Ms. Sinclair served as Co-Chair of the Writing Workgroup for the National Consensus Project

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(NCP) Clinical Practice Guidelines for Quality Palliative Care, 4th edition and managed the efforts of the Serious Illness Quality Alignment Hub, a project funded by the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation. The latter convened palliative care experts and U.S. health care quality leaders to create requirements and incentives for palliative care access and adherence to standards. She currently serves as Vice Chairperson of the Nebraska Palliative Care and Quality of Life Advisory Council. Ms. Sinclair received both her MPP and her BA in Social Work from the University of Maryland, Baltimore County.


