We wanted to let you know that congratulations are in order! POLST (Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment) is now law in Hawai'i. Thank you to everyone who worked to make Act 186 a reality.

Act 186 (HB1379 HD2 SD2 CD1) became law on July 15th without the governor's signature.

Please visit the Kokua Mau website for more information about POLST in the near future. The core team will be meeting shortly to determine next steps and develop a statewide form. As this legislation takes effect, our website will become a central repository for information related to POLST and the bill's implication for people living in Hawai'i.

July Topics POLST now law Ann Lecompte Teepa Snow

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
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The training program was developed by Kokua Mau in collaboration with the Cancer Information Service-Pacific Region (CIS) in partnership with the Pacific Center of Excellence in the Elimination of Disparities (Pacific CEED). The formal three-day program for the public was followed by two days of internal meetings with key staff and trainings at the hospital. A final report will be posted to the website in the next month.

This is the second event Kokua Mau has collaborated on this year to increase our work with Pacific Islanders and is a follow-up to the Caring the Pacific Way course held in April (click here for more information).
