Out of home overnight care facilities provide non-medical care for frail seniors in need of supervision, personal services, protection, assistance and guidance. Agencies offering out of home overnight care are listed in below. Services provided: Meals, personal care, assistance with toileting, walking, transferring, feeding, nursing and medication administration.

Costs: Approximately \$150 - 200/night usually an out-of-pocket expense. Short term respite care may be provided by QEXA if authorized by the physician as part of a senior's care plan. The VA health plan provides respite care for veterans at the Center for Aging. Hospice offers respite for caregivers, if needed. Tips: Caregiver burnout is a consideration for approval of respite care. (Source: Housing options for seniors on Oahu – 2009, KKV)
