ExCEL is a growing community of dedicated social workers committed to improving the delivery of psychosocial care. Essential elements of the program include strategies for improved team functioning and collaboration, screening and assessment, family-conferencing, culturally-sensitive communication, and advocacy and leadership. Selected social workers will identify a goal that they will seek to achieve after attending an ExCEL course. In addition to the course, all participants will be offered structured follow-up post-course by the ExCEL team and support from the ExCEL community in the form of networking, mentorship, various media and social media outlets, and a variety of other opportunities to personalize their commitment to improve the delivery of psychosocial-spiritual care.

There is no cost to attend ExCEL once accepted. Registration is free, materials, meals and hotel for one night are included in the ExCEL acceptance. (Travel costs are not included).
