# Interesting Palliative and End-of-life Care Articles

There have been several interesting and much discussed articles that have come out recently. The first is a <u>New Yorker article</u> by Atul Gawande, MD and eloquently describes the process of different doctors and patients as they make end-of-life decisions, including his own considerations as he struggles with care decisions for his patients.

Another important feature article appeared in The New York Times, Frank Talk About Care at Life's End by Jane Brody. The article focuses on new palliative care laws and new research, including The New England Journal of Medicine study.

And finally a much discussed study *Early Palliative Care for Patients with Metastatic Non-Small-Cell Lung Cancer* published in <a href="The New England Journal of Medicine">The New England Journal of Medicine</a> (N Engl J Med 2010; 363:733-742). The study reported that among 151 patients with newly diagnosed metastatic lung cancer, those who received palliative care, which is care focused on symptoms, along with standard cancer therapy had a better quality of life, experienced less depression, were less likely to receive aggressive end-of-life care and lived nearly three months longer than those who received cancer treatment alone.
