

Advance Care Planning Medical Assistant and Licensed Practical Nurse Class

- Promote patients' knowledge of advance directives including health care power of attorney designation.
- Describe the differences between the an Advance Directive and Provider Order for Life-Sustaining Treatment (POLST) and implement correct documentation of these documents.
- Implement and standardize ACP processes in the clinic.
- Identify the Hawai'i requirements of Medical Aid in Dying, Our Care, Our Choice Act.
