EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

After completing this educational activity, participants should be able to:

- Discuss psychedelic-assisted psychotherapy for burnout
- Describe how to adapt serious illness conversations for virtual encounters
- Discuss best practice recommendations for assessment of pain in older adults with dementia
